

### CSSD Redevelopment

The new Central Sterile Supply Department (CSSD) is now in operation at Burnside Hospital. This complex redevelopment is an essential upgrade to comply with new national sterilisation standards AS/NSZ 4187:2014 for Reprocessing of Reusable Medical Devices in Health Service Organisations.

There are five new key considerations all CSSDs must now comply with: Water Quality, Device Identification and Traceability, New Equipment, Product Families, and Space, Layout and Design.

"The new department is a blessing," said Allison Turtur, CSSD Co-ordinator. "We are really conscientiously moving forward to provide the best possible service we can, to ensure we maintain the high standards that we are known for at Burnside Hospital. In particular, the Cart Washer-

Disinfector will be an absolute game changer for us moving forward."

Bardie Simpson OAM, longstanding Foundation Committee member and donor, generously donated towards the purchase of a Cart Washer-Disinfector.

This equipment enables entire carts to be washed and disinfected at once, improving efficiency by reducing staff time, water and energy consumption.

"The new Central Sterile Supply Department is a credit to everyone who works at Burnside Hospital. It is fantastic. It gave me such pleasure to contribute towards the Cart Washer-Disinfector, it's a good feeling and I feel proud to be part of something which will have such benefit for our community," said Bardie.

#### **Better Beds**

Burnside Hospital was one of the first private hospitals to purchase electric beds, which have served us well for many years. However, following patient feedback and a reduction in availability of parts for repair, we have started the process of replacing every bed. They are all being upgraded to the Howard Wright M10 Beds, with features for improved comfort, safety and usability.

"From a patient's perspective, the new beds are really good and safe. The controls are easy for patients to use and the light under the bed makes it safer to move around at night. It's really exciting to have the beds," says Loreen Bykow, Enrolled Nurse Ward Clerk.

In addition to increased patient comfort and independence, the new beds are also safer and easier for staff to work with.

"There is a lot of manual handling in our jobs," says Karen Minshall, Registered Nurse and Work Health and Safety Representative. "The new beds make it much easier to transition patients in and out, and they are easier to move around. The split cot sides allow for better manoeuvering, minimising the strain on nurses and reducing risk and injuries."
